

Summer School July/August 2021

Our 10 day summer school ran from Monday 26th July to Friday 6th August 2021, and was offered to all pupils in our incoming Year 7, Year 8 and Year 9 cohorts. A particular effort was made to engage these vulnerable pupils, as nearly all of these students are PP and all have EHCPs, and so the parents of these students were targeted with telephone calls encouraging them to participate.

Demographics

Joseph Norton Academy Summer School was attended by 14 out of 25 eligible pupils as follows:

- 4/5 Year 6 pupils (80% of the cohort) transitioning into Year 7 - signed up to attend week 1 (1 pupil was on holiday) - 5/5 Year 6 pupils (full cohort) signed up to attend the 2nd week
- 4/8 Year 7 pupils (50% of the cohort) transitioning into Year 8 - week 1 of Summer School
- 6/12 Year 8 pupils (50% of the cohort) transitioning into Year 9 - week 2 of Summer School

Of the 13 pupils offered a place at the 1st week of Summer School, 8 /13 pupils (62%) accepted the offer.

Of the 17 pupils offered a place at the 2nd week of Summer School, 11/17 pupils (65%) accepted the offer.

Of the group of pupils who attended, the following demographics applied:

- 100% were Pupil Premium Pupils
- 100% had an EHCP
- 0% were Looked After Children
- 0% were subject to a Child Protection Plan
- 7% were subject to Child In Need planning
- 7% had an open Early Help Assessment
- 86% were FSM eligible

Attendance - Average daily attendance over the fortnight stood at 83%.

Of the 8 pupils who accepted the offer of Summer School ***in the 1st week***, the following attendance rates were observed.
